
- Purposes:

Types of Files Accepted

- 1. Photographs: jpg, tiff, psd, raw, etc.
- 2. Maps, drawings, posters: doc, ai, svg, pdf, etc.
- 3. Audio clips: mp3, wav, aiff, etc.
- 4. Video clips: mpg, mp4, mov, avi, etc.
- 5. Slide shows: ppt, pps, pptx, ppsx, etc.

Open to the public for their:

- use
- contributions



Accessible via the Internet






Information for each object:

- title / subject
- description / location / key words
- date
- creator (e.g. photographer, artist)
- image type (e.g. photo, drawing)
- computer format (e.g. jpeg, mov)
- size (kilobytes)
- original copyright holder
- etc.

Information for each object = searchable

- essentially free use according to license selected
- creators maintain copyright control
